POLK COUNTY, TEXAS COVID-19 CASES, HOSPITALIZATIONS, THERAPEUTICS, COVID-19 VACCINE AND TESTING LOCATIONS

In Polk County and all across the State of Texas, healthcare workers and public health officials are seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations. According to the Texas Department of State Health Services (Texas DSHS), Polk County's Level of Community Transmission is **HIGH**. The following is a breakdown of the increase in cases over the past few weeks:

Polk County

Nov 23rd – Dec 7th	16 positive cases reported
Dec 7 th – Dec 21 st	58 positive cases reported
Dec 21 st – Jan 4 th	364 positive cases reported

According to the Angelina County & Cities Health District, counts of submitted positive tests from 1/7/2022 to 1/10/2022 saw an increase of **289 cases** for Polk County.

Texas DSHS estimates Polk County has 370 active cases at this time. Polk County has had a total of 221 COVID-related fatalities throughout the pandemic. The South East Texas Regional Advisory Council reports that 7 patients with COVID-19 are hospitalized in Polk County and 2 of those patients are in ICU.

MESSAGE FROM ANGELINA COUNTY & CITIES HEALTH DISTRICT

Vaccines are readily available in East Texas, so get vaccinated and get your booster. Vaccinate your kids.

The current number of positives are far above anything we have seen so far with COVID-19. The Omicron variant is much more contagious and more people than ever before are being exposed and testing positive.

The unvaccinated, the elderly and the young who are not eligible for vaccinations are vulnerable to severe disease.

If you test positive, stay home for 5 days from onset of symptoms or your positive test date until ALL symptoms have resolved and continue to wear a mask in all public settings.

The drive-thru COVID-19 test site located in the parking lot behind the Polk County Annex Building at 602 E. Church St in Livingston is open. Normal operating hours for this test site are Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

To register for a test at this site, visit <u>https://cov19.health</u> and enter POLKCOTX for the office location code. Please make sure you enter your information correctly with no typos. Typing incorrect registration information could interfere with you obtaining your results.

STATE OF TEXAS VACCINATION ASSISTANCE

Texas businesses, groups, or civic organizations with 5 or more persons who voluntarily choose to be vaccinated against COVID-19 can call the State Vaccine Call Center at 844-90-TEXAS (844-908-3927) and select option 4 to schedule a visit from a state mobile vaccination team.

Texans who are homebound can call 844-90-TEXAS (844-908-3927) and select option 2 to request a state mobile vaccination team to come to their home.

COVID-19 MONOCLONAL ANTIBODY INFUSION THERAPY

The state-supported Polk County Regional Infusion Center at the Dunbar Gymnasium in Livingston closed on October 30, 2021.

Texas DSHS reported in December that there is a national shortage of Sotrovimab, which is distributed by the federal government. Sotrovimab is the monoclonal antibody that can decrease the risk of severe disease from the COVID-19 Omicron variant.

COVID-19 ORAL ANTIVIRAL DRUGS

According to Texas DSHS, oral antiviral drugs, Paxlovid and Molnupiravir are now available for high-risk patients with mild/moderate COVID-19 infection. A limited supply has been shipped to pharmacies; more shipments will depend on allocations from the federal government. Due to limited availability, all patients may not initially be able to receive medication. Visit https://dshs.texas.gov/coronavirus/therapeutics/ for more information.

Polk County pharmacies report they have no COVID-19 oral antiviral drugs in stock at this time. Please check availability with your pharmacy if your doctor prescribes this medication for you.

RAPID ANTIBODY TESTING NOW AVAILABLE

Your health insurance will cover the cost of the test.

If you are uninsured there is a \$39 fee for the test.

A COVID-19 antibody test is a simple finger prick blood test, and is to assess for previous exposure to COVID-19.

POSITIVE RESULTS

If your test results are positive, you may have developed antibodies from the COVID-19 vaccine or from a previous infection with the virus. Even if you test positive for antibodies, you should continue to follow CDC guidance regarding social distancing, frequent hand washing and wear a mask to protect yourself and others. Positive results do not mean that you're completely protected against contracting COVID-19 in the future.

NEGATIVE RESULTS

Negative results mean that you were not infected in the past.
